Sendai Framework references to displacement

Target (B)

Substantially reduce the number of affected people globally by 2030

- Prevent and reduce disaster displacement risk: transboundary risk, relocation of human settlements
- Develop policies and programmes on disaster-induced human mobility, including host communities
- Conduct exercises to ensure rapid and effective response to displacement
- Include temporary settlements within post-disaster recovery and rehabilitation efforts
- Ensure the **inclusion** of displaced people and migrants in DRR

WiA guideline on disaster displacement

Objective

Support Governments and disaster risk reduction (DRR) actors to address disaster displacement in:

- DRR strategies—supporting Sendai Target (E)
- Climate change adaptation and sustainable development plans
- Sectoral plans (land-use, housing, education, health, migration) How?
- reduce disaster displacement risk
- protect the rights of those displaced and address specific needs
- help them find **durable solutions**

Displacement-specific needs and protection of rights

- Lack of shelter
- Limited livelihood opportunities
- Lack of documents needed to access services
- Exposure to further hazards
- Family separation
- Discrimination
- Heightened risk of gender-based violence and human trafficking
- Psychosocial impacts
- Weak or absent social support networks

2. Strengthening governance to address disaster displacement risk

3. Investing in DRR for resilience to reduce displacement risk



- Inclusion in DRR strategies and plans
- Targeting resilience-building programmes to displaced people and those at risk of displacement
- Formal recognition of informal or marginal settlements
- Identification of areas suitable for planned relocation

4. Enhancing preparedness for effective response to disaster displacement and to "build back better" in recovery, rehabilitation and reconstruction

- Risk knowledge, early warning systems and evacuation plans
- Displaced people and those at-risk engaged in planning
- Plans include projections for long-term displacement
- Sites identified for temporary and permanent resettlement
- Local authorities have budget and authority to assist displaced population



Support for countries and regions on use of the WIA

- Support the review of national (DRR, climate change, sectoral) policies to integrate needed elements on disaster displacement
- Support the development of new policies or strategies on disaster displacement
- Provide training to policy makers and DRR actors on disaster displacement based on the WiA guideline and checklist, including through e-learning course
